Once you have installed Logon WorkShop you'll see the listing of skins that have been downloaded for your computer. These skins are stored in a folder in your "C:\Users" folder. To find this folder simply look in your C:\Users folder and then open the folder called "Logon1". Alternatively you can find the Logon1 folder by going to Start and then clicking on Computer. After you find the folder just click on the dropdown arrow and choose the "New" option to create a new folder. To install a new skin, click the "Open" or "Save" button. A dialog box will appear asking you to select the skin that you wish to apply. Click the "Open" button to open the folder containing the skin you would like to install. If you wish to keep the skins on your computer (instead of installing them), click the "Save" button. To select a new skin, click the "New" or "Load" button. This will open a list of skins. If you wish to change the skin already installed on your computer click the "New" button to install a new skin. If you want to go back to the previous skin click the "Back" button.
